The meetings would shift back to 2nd Thursday 7pm in the better weather.

### Warren County ARTS 25 year Anniversary Proposals-

#### **Proposals:**

**A: Trip to Olde Lyme Connecticut:** 3 - 4 day trip in September or October with Jean & Gordon Perry as our guides. Travel time is about 4.5hrs each way depending on traffic. Carpool or shuttle bus from Oxford. Cost per person for shuttle TBD.

Visit Florence Griswald House (\$10 entry fee) & Museum and Weir Farm National Historic Site (free). 2 nights in hotel. Rates from \$150 -200/room/night depending where we stay. We need to find out if breakfasts are included, but certainly lunches & dinners would be our choice. Potentially about \$500-600 per person, less if you share a room with someone.

#### B. Cruise from New York Harbor: Cruise Line: Princess

Carpool or shuttle bus from Oxford. Cost per person for shuttle TBD.

Cruise Price inclusive of all meals & entertainment while onboard. Gratuities & Taxes extra. Passport required. Sleep onboard every night. Full day off ship at each stopping point. Wander on your own or pay extra for dockside tours.

*Option A*: 5 nights Canada/New England Round trip (10/21/17) from \$599/person double occupancy (inside room). Itinerary: NYC, St John, Halifax, NYC.

*Option B*: 7 nights Canada/New England round trip (10/14/17) from \$899/person double occupancy (inside room). Itinerary NYC, Halifax, St John, Bar Harbor, Boston, New Port, NYC.

#### C. Longwood / Brandywine Tour

Carpool or shuttle bus from Oxford. Cost per person for shuttle TBD.

3-4 days. 2.5-3 hour drive each way.

- ♦ Longwood Gardens(\*) \$18 Seniors.
- ♦ Brandywine (Andrew Wyeth) Museum (\*) \$10 Seniors.
- ♦ Other possibilities:
  - ♦ Winterthur(\*) (An American Downton Abby) in Winterthur, DE (\$8).
  - ♦ Historic Houses of Odessa, Odessa DE (\$28)
  - ♦ Nemours House and Gardens, Wilmington, DE (\$15).
- ♦ Wilmington-Western Railroad Train 1.5 hr ride from Wilmington DE to Ashland DE. \$18 seniors.
- ♦ Hotels: range in price from \$109/night (sleeps 4) + complimentary breakfast (Inn at Wilmington), \$119/night double occupancy at Wyndham Garden Glen Mills Wilmington, or \$150/night double occupancy at Mendenhall Inn for the Brandywine Sampler I which includes hot breakfast buffet and 2 entry tickets to 2 of the local attractions (\*)
- ♦ Estimated total price person ~ \$140 \$250. Cost per person for shuttle TBD.

#### C. Trip to Silver Lake, NJ

Carpool or shuttle bus from Oxford. Cost per person for shuttle TBD.

3 days. 2.5-3 hour drive each way. Nancy Geiger would be our guide. Further details for this proposal are in the works.
