February Program Highlights

The February program on 2/9, 1-3pm with ROY KINZER is open to the Public. Free for Members and \$10 for non-members.

Roy has been part of the Golden Working Artist Program as a Golden Certified Working Artist since 2005.

Watermedia, Mixed Media & More

Four Health Benefits of Viewing Art

It's no secret that art can really transform a room. But what about your mood? There's hard evidence that even just looking at art can have a positive impact on your mood and mental health. Here are just four perks of viewing art.

- 1. Less Stress, Please! Chances are your or someone you know is more stressed than they should be. With heavy work loads, financial or family worries and to be quite honest, our current political climate, how is one supposed to stop and take a breather? Well, one <u>scientifically</u> <u>backed solution</u> is to take a moment to really look at art. Studies have shown that viewing and creating art, and participating in art therapy routines, decreased stress levels in participants.
- A Moment of Relief. In a similar 2. vein, science says viewing and creating art also helps alleviate symptoms of anxiety and depression. And while appreciating art alone is not an adequate form of managing how those conditions impact your life, its not a bad idea to surround yourself with art you love. Want more good news? These studies define art beyond the fine art youd find in museums, which means creative endeavors like music, doodling and pottery are all your friends here.
- 3. More Brain Power. Looking at art puts your brain to work. Our brains are wired to pick out familiar patterns, extract meaning from anything we see and even make us feel immersed in an artwork. So whether

you're looking at a photograph, an

iar forms and feels. When you develop an emotional attachment to an image, you're going to appreciate it that much more.

4. A Labor of Love. Researchers in the UK have discovered that looking at art we consider to be beautiful triggers the same pleasurable physical response as when we fall in love which is caused by our brains releasing dopamine. So choose to surround yourself with art you love- it's good for you!
