May Program Highlights - Watercolor Plein Air Experiences

The May 9th WCARTS group meeting will feature Richard Polinski's talk about his experiences and journey as a plein air painter.

Richard is an amateur plein air watercolor painter and a professional cabinetmaker. He started painting three years ago and considers himself to be just a beginner. Richard lives in Milford, NJ and generally paints after work on the way home and while hiking on weekends, usually in southern NJ. Richard has posted online photos of his painting from the start and

made a commitment to post everything whether he thought it was any good or not. He feels that helps to

keep him honest with himself and is a reminder that learning is a process and part of the fun and satisfaction.

Richard's presentation will be on his experiences since he started painting



and will include discussions of how he got started, decisions about tools and

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Get Ready to Paint Outdoors!

Thanks to Olya Powzaniuk for this great article about Plein Air Painting! There's nothing like trying to capture what you see in the landscape amidst the natural light; whether it's a bright sunny day, or cloudy and getting ready to rain. Not too popular during the Renaissance, painting outdoors exploded in the 18th century, the Impressionists ran away with the art form, Monet and Van Gogh made it a habit. They both loved to be in the middle of nature, and painted outdoors to understand "natural light' and what it did to natures colors, shapes, shadows and water. If this is something you've wanted to try, there are a couple of things to think through. For some artists its second nature, and they go out to paint in all seasons, under all conditions.

Be Prepared: if you are, then the more fun your first experiences will be and there are a couple of essentials that should be on your mind when getting ready to go out. + wear neutral colored clothes, so your presence isn't a distraction to other artists, especially those near you. + Wear comfortable shoes +Bring a hat for sun or a visor. Put on your sunscreen and bring bugspray. You may want to use an umbrella to provide shade for painting. + bring water to keep yourself hydrated + using a cart on wheels will make getting around with all your stuff a lot easier or use a backpack for your equipment. +Travel light and don't bring along equipment that you will not need. Simplify your palette. +If you like to start with an under painting, bring along your spray alcohol and brush, takes 2 minutes to dry outside! +Handwipes and roll of paper towels & plastic bag for waste. + You

want to be comfortable with your set-up and equipment and you will need to decide if you want to stand at an easel or sit. Some parks have picnic tables and benches will are handy.

What else? After you've arrive at the arboretum or park, take some time to observe the scene around you. Walk the property and make a mental note of the 2 or 3 scenes or panoramas that grab your attention. If it doesn't appeal to you, don't paint it just because everyone else is painting it! Once you decided where you'd like to paint, plan your approach before you start: use a



viewfinder to capture your scene and do a small value sketch; select what you will leave out, which doesn't support the focal point of your scene.

Remember the

outdoor painter's golden rule: SQUINT often to focus on shapes; OPEN WIDE to see color! You have 2 -3 hours to complete your piece, once you've started. Seize the light! Start small so you don't get overwhelmed.

During the hot summer, don't paint between 11am and 2pm, your shadows are much better in the early hours and then after 3pm.

You can spend hours looking for that perfect composition that just isn't there - embrace the reality around you to tell your artful story.



The Pup Who Paints. (Womans Day Magazine May 2019) A talented dog makes art for charity. Sporting a red beret and holding a paintbrush in his mouth, Dagger, aka "DogVinci" is a 6 yr old Black Lab-Golden Retriever mix, isn't afraid of a blank canvas. Dagger was adopted by Massapequa NY Artist Yvonne Dagger in 2014. One day Yvonne noticed Dagger watching her as she painted with acrylics. "I said, 'Dagger, what do you want? Do you want to paint?' and his tail started to wag," Yvonne says. "So I figured as a joke I'd let him try." She placed an easel on the floor and used commands like "push" and "get" to help him spread the paint. Once she realized his interest wasn't a fluke, Yvonne constructed a paintbrush holder using paper towel tubes and duct tape. Dagger even has a painting routine: After a few strokes of the brush dipped in nontoxic paint, he pauses so Yvonne can put more paint on it or adjust the canvas. As Daggers talent grew, Yvonne launched local workshops with him and started selling his art, donating the proceeds to charities including St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Canine Companions for Independence and local rescue groups. So far Dagger has painted over 500 pieces, leading to charitable donations of about \$75,000 and earning him the nickname "Do Good Dog".
