
Pam Dulaff and Donna Gratkowski have been busy exhibiting in outdoor art festi-

The Sept 14th Warren County ARTS group meeting will feature Elaine Kurie, professional artist, demonstrating her Contemporary Realism style of painting.

Artist Statement: "My paintings have been described as calming, restorative and imbued with a quiet stillness. I often paint simple objects arranged in minimalists compositions to convey a sense of balance and harmony, and because I find beauty and elegance in simplicity.

Although my subjects are varied, they are tied together by my use of a restrained color palette, my use of grays containing subtle undertones of color, and by my particular handling of light and shadow, especially when working under natural light."



Elaine recently received 1st place in the Portrait Society of America's Member 2016 Competition for an oil portrait which was published in the March 2017 issue of *International Artist Magazine* along with the other top winners. She was awarded The Butler Institute of Art Award recently and has received several Grumbacher Gold Medals. Elaine is also a member of the International Guild of Realism and the Portrait Society of America.
