
Sept Program Highlights - Jean Perry: A Brief History of Woodstock

In a Slump? Here are some exercises to help you find your mojo-



What's an artist to do when they've hit a total roadblock in their creative practice? Artists put so much pressure on themselves to have an impressive creative practice that they do regularly. Sometimes the pressure can actually result in blocking you from getting anything done. It can be a great practice to just doodle. It gets your mid and hand going. There are a number of ways to work through this, including this activity, which was inspired by childhood. Do you remember sitting in front of a worksheet while your elementary school teacher read off a set of various tasks to complete on the page? Follow the steps below, but don't think too much. Who knows what you'll create?

- Paint a light layer of acrylic paint on the page
- When dry, use a stencil and white paint to add a pattern to the page
- Tear a scrap of paper, and adhere it to the edge of the paint
- Scribble four circles on the page. Color inside some of the circles, doodle within some of the other circles
- Use a pencil eraser to stamp dots onto the page.



It can be fun and a great challenge to add texture to your work. Try creating different sorts of textures that can later be incorporated into collages, journal pages and more.

- Draw six rectangular boxes that are ~ 2" x 8" in size on a piece of sturdy paper or cardboard.
- 1st box, Use a palette knife (or old credit card) to spread texture paste (remember the free sample received when we had the Golden paint demonstration earlier this year?) inside the box. Don't worry if some areas are thicker than others the goal here is not consistency.
- In the second box, apply an even layer of texture paste. While it is still wet, randomly embed scraps of lace or paper doilies. Go over the scraps with another layer of texture paste.
- In the 3rd box, apply a layer of texture paste. While it is still wet, crumple a napkin or tissue paper and embed it in the paste. Go over the crumpled paper with some texture paste.
- 4th box, apply a thick layer of texture paste. While it is still wet, use texture tools to create designs in the paste. A fork will do, or bubble wrap, or a dry sponge- you get the idea.
- 5th box, apply an even layer of texture paste. While it is still wet, embed a piece of string in the paste and cover with some more texture paste.
- 6th box- combine at *least* two of the previous texture techniques in this box.


