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October Program Highlights: Understanding Picasso Lecture with Barbara Stoffels



Please join us for a lecture about Understanding Picasso given by Barbara Stoffels. Saturday Oct 8th, 1-3pm at the Oxford Municipal Building, 11 Green St., Oxford, NJ.

Barbara says "I asked a friend what she thought of Picasso. Her emphatic response was that she did not like him! I explained that likely every artist has an inner Picasso." Pablo Picasso struggled for years with many demons, and nowhere is this more evident than in his struggle to produce Les Demoiselles d'Avignon. Our journey thru the development of this monumental groundbreaking work lends itself to a 21st century happening.

Barbara studied art at Douglass College in the 60's under Roy Lichtenstein, Jeffrey Hendricks, and traveled cross campus to Rutgers where Alan Kaprow and Andy

Warhol held sway. She married, raised two daughters, divorced, bred horses, ran businesses and even managed a lobbyist's office in Trenton. Barbara's art was juried all over south Jersey and won enough to keep her going. Now back home in Warren County, Barbara hopes you enjoy her take on that Picasso guy who shocked the art world with his enormous contributions.

Sad goodbye to Kathleen Jusko

I was scrolling around online looking up folks that I hadn't seen posts from in a while and was greatly saddened to discover that long time Warren County ARTS member, Kathleen Jusko passed away in February this year. Kathleen had been a continuous member of Warren County Arts since 1998 and held several positions on the Board of Directors for a number of years including Vice President from 2012-2019. Kathleen was a resident of Schooley's Mountain, NJ and lived all her life in the same house where her Father had been born and where she ran her hair salon business. She started painting in 1982 primarily in oils but eventually switched to watercolors and was well known for her paintings on upcycled roofing slates. Kathleen and her



husband Joe attended my wedding in 2015 and always participated in programs and day trips. Kathleen was a generous soul, deeply religious and you'll find many of her delicious homestyle recipes in the Warren County ARTs Cooks! Cookbook.





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Artist Glimpse by Jean M. Perry: "Jamie Wyeth" (1946- present)

Most of us are familiar with the Wyeth family of artists. We all have read children's books, such as "Camelot" and "King Arthur's Round Table", illustrated by N.C. Wyeth and we have analyzed "Christina's World" and admired "Helga" by Andrew Wyeth (N.C.'s son). But how many of us have discovered the beautiful and psychological work of Jamie Wyeth, Andrew's son and N.C.'s grandson?

James Browning Wyeth was born in Chadds Ford, Pennsylvania in 1946 into the famous artist family. Jamie wanted to be an artist early in life. Although N.C. studied with famed illustrator, Howard Pyle, and Andrew studied with his father, N.C., Jamie studied with Andrew's sister, Carolyn, another fine artist in the family. (Andrew also had another well-known sister artist, Henriette) With most of Carolyn's work in oils, Jamie fell in love with the medium, leaving any thoughts of pursuing tempera, Andrew's

primary medium. Inspired by the character studies of his father and the storybook paintings of his grandfather, Jamie developed his own style, thanks to this awesome background of artists.

> I remember a televised interview with Jamie in which he commented on the unrelenting criticism over his and his father's art, and the alienation of their style and subject matter during the Modern era of the 20th C. While some cheered or analyzed the "deep" and sometimes bazaar styles of the time, Wyeth artwork focuses on people and places they know, capturing it realistically and

precisely. I once heard that they felt there was enough subject matter here to never leave America. They concentrated on their locales of Maine and Pennsylvania. This can be seen in Jamie's art as in his 1967 portrait of a pensive JFK (for which he

studied many photos of the deceased president), or the "cool" but worried look of his sitter in "Draft Age" (1965) in which we remember the Vietnam War. Jamie himself served in the U.S. Air Corps Reserve





from 1966-1971.

"Pumpkinhead" is a self-portrait! He does have a sense of humor! In this work, Jamie is secretly observing everything around him. He has a sneer on his face, the face of the pumpkin head. It leads me to interpret the animals that inspire his art. They have expressions; they

observe the world around them, sometimes just looking happy. ("Portrait of a Pig" 1970). And on Jamie's farm in Maine, he has much to observe!

When you get a chance, take a ride out to of the studios and the River Museum which is head up to New England (we stayed in Rockland Farnsworth Museum in Rockland, Maine for more Wyeth art!

Here's a photo of the recipe from the bag of Blue Diamond Almond Flour. I added 1 tsp of freeze dried coffee in step 3 and chocolate chips on top while still hot from oven. Voila!

ALMOND BROWNIES

INGREDIENTS:

% CUP BUTTER 4 02. SEMI-SWEET CHOCOLATE % CUP PACKED BROWN SUGAR 1% CUP SUGAR 1% TEASPOONS VANILLA EXTRACT 2 EGGS 1% CUPS BLUE DIAMOND® ALMOND FLOUR % CUP CHOOPED ALMONDS

DIRECTIONS:

 PREHEAT OVEN TO 350°F AND LIGHTLY BUTTER AN 8-INCH BAKING PAN.
 ALLY BUTTER AN 8-INCH BAKING PAN.
 LIGHTLY BUTTER AND CHOCOLATE IN A MEDIUM SAUCPAN OVER VERY LOW HEAT.
 STIR IN SUGGARS AND VANILLA; SET ASIDE TO COOL.
 4. ADD EGGS AND BEAT WELLT O INCORPORATE STIR IN ALMOND FLOUR AND MIX WELL. THEN STIR IN CHOCOLATE CHIPS AND ALMONDS S. SPREAD EVENLY IN PREPARED PAN, BAKE FOR 30 TO 35 MINUTES OR UNTIL A TOTATIPIC INSERTED INTO THE CENTER COMES OUT CLEAN 9. LET COOL COMPLETELY BEFORE CHITTING INTO SQUARES.
