

November Program Highlights - Claire Rohloff: Silk Painting

Join us for a hands on workshop about painting on Silk with member Claire Rohloff.

A Habotai 8mm 8" x 72" silk scarf will be supplied on a freezer paper back for a \$5.00 fee for WCARTS members.



We will be using sharpie permanent markers and rubbing alcohol (91% works best) to paint on the scarf. Bring a small spray bottle for the alcohol if you have one. I will supply also. Bring sharpies of colors you wish to use and

an idea for a design or make it up as you go along, seeing how the colors and alcohol work together on the silk. I will have some stencils available - but bring your own if you have something you like. You will go home with a finished silk scarf ready to wear, after heat setting lightly with an iron so it can be hand washed. It would make a great Holiday gift!

Claire M Rohloff

Claire became interested in Warren County Arts when a fellow member, Patti Tivnan invited her to join a meeting. Claire was especially drawn to the group because of the varied nature of programs, and opportunity to get back to painting after a long period of pursuing other hobby's such gardening, garment sewing, quilting, dyeing and painting fabric, lampwork (making beads with a torch), polymer

clay, fused glass and PMC jewelry.

Claire always liked drawing, but a career in psychiatric nursing paid the bills. While working as a nurse Claire went back to Kean University to pursue her interest in art and was drawn to the Interior Design program there. She graduated with a degree in Fine Art, with Interior Design background. Her career changed from nursing to Health Facility Deign. She worked in the engineering department at Overlook Hospital as the in-house designer doing space planning for areas that needed renovation. Her studies further led her to Pratt where she graduated with an MS in Interior Design. She taught Interior Design classes, such as drafting, space planning, textiles, lighting, etc. at Kean University, Centenary, and The College of NJ. She is an alumna of the Master Gardener Program with Rutgers Cooperative Extension. Returning to her original interest in healthcare led her to study Asian Medicine such as Shiatsu, Jin Shin Do, Five Element Chinese Medicine and yoga. She has traveled extensively through Europe and to China to learn massage techniques with the China Academy of Traditional Chinese Medicine in Beijing, China.

Claire and her late husband built their house (hammered the nails) from a kit which is a geodesic dome with some help from professional carpenters, etc. Actually 2 domes, one is living space and the other is an attached studio. Claire designed the interior space.

Are You a Fearless Artist?

A FEARLESS ARTIST IS: (IN NO PARTICULAR ORDER...)

- Patient. Recognize that you process what you are ready for, and can't rush the development process.
 Enjoy the journey!
- Forgiving. Mistakes become opportunities for learning, not proof we are failing.
- **Vulnerable**. By showing who we are in our art, we are willing to reveal our flaws, but we also get to show our love and passion for the medium, which connects us to the beautiful, flawed people who will resonate with our work.
- Imperfect. Having a "gift" that makes art easy is a myth. By embracing imperfection, we let go of fear of the blank page and don't let mistakes define our identity.
- **Hard-working**. The act of painting, however flawed, becomes significant. Whatever approach you are taking to develop your painting skills is okay, as long as you are painting, you are learning.
- **Self-caring**. Not obsessed with justifying the cost of art supplies, because you recognize the value of the investment in your mental health and creativity.
- Insightful. I spend time thinking about my motivations, seeking out and challenging the fears that hold me back, watching for the

- moments when I fall in love with my own work and seeking to create more opportunities for that to happen.
- Seeks mentors, not gurus. I grew most when I stopped waiting for someone to tell me what to do, and began modeling my painting practice on what I observed in others. A mentor comes alongside and supports, rather than reaching down to point out your next step, or try to haul you up to their level.
- **Determined.** You may not be able to choose how quickly you will learn, but you can decide to be too stubborn to quit. Persist in faith that time invested will grow your skills.
- **Trusting.** Trusting the process means you don't have to become a master artist today, but you can step incrementally closer when you choose to invest time in creating art. Paint applied by brush, over and over again, is the ONLY way to grow your skills. Study alone won't do it. Reading, watching videos, even taking workshops; they are a great part of the process, but without the DO there is no result.
- Fun-loving. If I can't choose how fast I learn, and if it's going to take a long time, I want to have as much fun as possible in the interim. I see joy in my painting journey, and I also recognize that when I am playing, I am revealing my most authentic self.
- **Seeking**. I don't have all the answers. No matter how much I learn about watercolor, I am still just scratching the surface. I look, and listen, and seek to always be open to new ideas and the possibilities they contain.
- Reflective. I cannot stay encouraged in my journey if I am continually pushing myself to be better, and never looking back to celebrate all I have achieved. (This is one reason I rarely destroy old paintings; they are such a part of my history and have contributed so much to my growth!)
- Long Term/Forward Looking. I don't have to accomplish everything now. Small steps of progress accumulate when you are committed to long-term development. Twenty-five years in, I see that more clearly than ever. All the times I wasted feeling bad that I didn't make MORE time to paint, without recognizing the value of accumulated small efforts.
- **Open to change.** No matter how much experience or knowledge I have, there is always more to learn, and a new direction to take. I believe creativity lies in the unexpected, thus, I cannot find my most creative work inside my comfort zone.
