For November & December, Warren County ARTS will have a MEMBERS ONLY exhibit of 14 pieces of our best artwork on display in the ASBURY COFFEE MILL, on Old Main Street in Asbury, NJ. No Entry fee for paid members of WCARTS. If more than 14 pieces are entered, it will be up to the owner of ACM which pieces are accepted and which are rejected due to space limitations. Artists will be notified if artwork is not accepted to be hung. ACM takes 25% commission on sales.

- Artists may submit 1 piece. No theme. Artwork must hang until end of the show unless sold.
- Artwork submitted MUST be 2 dimensional, wired and ready to hang, clean, and professional in appearance. Paintings, photography, mixed media, drawings, pastels etc are welcome. No nudes and no sculptures allowed. Artwork not meeting these requirements will be rejected.
- Artwork size limited to a minimum of 11x14 to 16 x 20 maximum. Preferably vertical orientation.
- Include short Artist Bio with Entry Form.
- Ribbon awarded for Popular Vote winner.

Asbury Coffee Mill, 431 Old Main Street, Asbury, NJ 08802. www.asburycoffeemill.com

The building was built in 1862. It has served Asbury as a general store, a deli and even a furniture store, and now its home of the Asbury Coffee Mill. The building underwent extensive renovations during the winter of 2016 and hopefully has been provided with another 150 years of service to the community.

About Asbury – The village was originally known as Hall's Mills and was settled prior to the Revolutionary War. It was named after the hall family who operated gristmills along the Musconetcong River. In 1796, the name was changed to Asbury in honor of Bishop Francis Asbury, who made frequent stops to the town to visit the McCullough family.

The Asbury Coffee Mill name pays homage to the early ills that established Hall's Mills. One of Asbury's oldest continuous businesses, Asbury Graphite (now Asbury Carbons) is a direct descentdant of the first mill purchased by their founder, Harry Riddle. That mill was orginally a flour mill built around the same time as this building. At one time this very building was owned, and possibly built by, and operated by James Riddle. James' son, Harry was the founder of the Asbury Graphite Mill.

The Asbury Coffee Mill is open for breakfast & lunch Wednesday—Friday 7am-2pm and Saturday/Sunday 8am-2pm. Breakfast is served till 11:30am weekdays and all day on the weekend. Live music every Sunday 11am-1pm.
