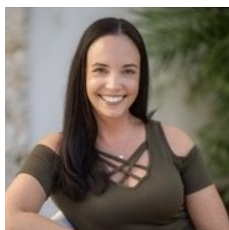

Doris Ettlinger—Watercolor: Spooky Tree



Learn to paint a lone tree ablaze in autumn color, accessorized with crows. An atmospheric back-ground lends a mysterious feel to this late October image. A good subject for all levels. Techniques include wet in wet washes, soft transitions of color, applying color with sponges, layering pure pigment and splattering. Photo reference will be provided, but you are welcome to bring your own picture of a tree.

Materials will be provided, however you are welcome to bring your own too:

- Brushes: #10 round and 3/4" oval Silver Black Velvet Brush
- Sea sponge or piece of Saran Wrap bunched up
- Paper: 140 lb cold press watercolor paper. The better the paper, the more satisfying the experience. Recommend a 9 x 12" Arches or Fabriano Watercolor block (not pad). The paper will dry flat because it is pre-stretched and glued on the sides. If you are new to watercolor and don't want to make an investment in paper, use Canson, or another brand.
- Pigments: With a limited palette being used, try professional grade tubes from Winsor & Newton, Holbein, Daniel Smith, or Sennelier. If you are new to watercolor, you can buy Cotman.
 - Cadmium Yellow or Winsor Yellow
 - Quinacridone Gold
 - Raw Sienna or Yellow Ochre
 - Burnt Sienna
 - Perylene Maroon or Alizarin Crimson
 - Cadmium Red or Winsor Red
 - Cobalt Blue
 - Ultramarine or French Ultramarine
 - Neutral Tint or Payne's GrayA Covered Palette is useful.

About Doris: An illustrator since graduating from the Rhode Island School of Design in 1973, Doris received an MFA from the University of Wisconsin. Over the course of her career she has illustrated 40 children's books and is represented by Cornell & Co. Doris has honed her watercolor skills by attending workshops and using the work of her mother Minnie Bush Ettlinger as her touchstone. Doris teaches the Musconetcong Watercolor Group, conducts workshops and demonstrates her technique for art groups. Her livestream demos appear on her YouTube channel. Doris is an elected member of the NJ Watercolor Society and a signature member of the Garden State Watercolor Society.

This way, participants can leave with multiple finished artworks and feel confident exploring pastels on their own. All materials needed will be supplied for the workshop.

Andrea works as a full time artist with private commissions of various subjects but focusing on animal portraiture. Andrea is a member of the Society of Animal Artists and The Pastel Society of America. Andrea teaches both adults and teens at the Visual Art center of New Jersey, The Center for Contemporary Art, The Hunterdon Art Museum and conducts private lessons and workshops, both in person and virtually.
